

Note: If there is a payment option which would result in the court ordering the release of the Incarcerated Individual, good behavior credit is NOT applied to the sentence calculation.

- C. Good behavior credit allowances may be reduced based on sustained disciplinary sanctions. In this case, a **JB-465-25 – Loss of Good Behavior Credit Form** will be delivered to Jail Records in order to adjust the sentence calculation. A copy of this form will remain in the associated Incarcerated Individual's Jail Records file. (Refer to JBGO-007-23).
- D. An Incarcerated Individual who has lost good behavior credit as a result of a sustained disciplinary sanction may petition to the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) to have good behavior credit restored utilizing **JB-351-24 – Request for Good Time Restoration**.
- E. Good behavior credit may fluctuate based on subsequent sentences which cause an increase in the sentence term.

II. Record Keeping

- A. In conjunction with the maintenance of other records and accounts as required by law, the Local Sentenced In-Custody List is a written record that is kept of every person confined in the Monroe County Jail who may be eligible to receive a discretionary reduction of a definite sentence or sentences, or who may be eligible to receive a discretionary reduction of the term or terms of civil commitment by reason of the application of good behavior allowances.
- B. A record provided (**JB-414 Sentence Term Calculation Form**) shall indicate the manner in which the discretionary good behavior allowance was calculated and applied to the term of the sentence(s) or civil commitment imposed by the court, to establish the date of discharge.
- C. Upon commencement of any sentence, the Incarcerated Individual will be provided a copy of the Sentence Term Calculation Form (JB-414), specifically explaining their sentence terms, including good time allowances pursuant to Correction Law 804 and/or Correction Law 804-a. The Incarcerated Individual will sign one copy and it will be returned to Jail Records and placed in their Jail Records file. The Incarcerated Individual will also be provided a copy of the Sentence Term Calculation Form for their own record keeping.
- D. All sentence term calculations, securing orders, and release orders will be maintained in the Jail Records folder for each associated individual. Upon release, the documents will be transferred to the Criminal Records Unit for storage in the individual's historical file.
- E. All information pertaining to the reason for commitment of an individual to the Monroe County Jail is provided to the public via the Monroe County Sheriff's website, specifically the Jail Census.


III. Weekend and Holiday Discharge Dates

- A. If the discharge date for an Incarcerated Individual falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the Incarcerated Individual shall be released from custody on the preceding Friday. If the discharge date for an Incarcerated Individual falls on a legal holiday, the Incarcerated Individual shall be released the preceding day, except when such legal holiday falls on a Monday, in which case the Incarcerated Individual shall be released from custody on the preceding Friday.
